

Income – Wages, Interest, etc. Time Required: 30 minutes

#### Introduction

This is the first of several lessons covering the Income section of the taxpayer's return. This lesson focuses on the income that is reportable on Form 1040. A critical component of completing the taxpayer's return is distinguishing between taxable and nontaxable income.

## Objectives

Compute taxable and nontaxable income.

Distinguish between earned and unearned income.

Report income correctly on Form 1040 and Schedule 1

## **Key Terms**

**Allocated Tips:** Tips an employer assigns to an employee. They are in addition to the tips the employee reported to the employer.

**Capital Gain Distributions:** Also called capital gain dividends. They come from mutual funds and real estate investment trusts (REITs).

Earned Income: Any income received for work, such as wages or business income.

**Gross Income:** All income received in the form of money, goods, property, and services that is not exempt from tax.

**Ordinary Dividends:** Corporate distributions paid out of the earnings and profits of the corporation.

**Taxable Income:** Adjusted Gross Income minus standard or itemized deductions.

**Tax-exempt Income:** Interest that is exempt from federal income tax such as bonds issued by state and political subdivisions (county or city), District of Columbia, and U.S. possessions and political subdivisions.

**Unearned Income:** Any income produced by investments, such as interest on savings, dividends on stocks, or rental income.

Determining taxable and nontaxable income

**Ask** students to explain the differences between taxable and nontaxable income.

**Ask** students to provide examples of income that may need to be reported on the tax return, but is not included in income.

**Ask** students to explain earned income vs. unearned income.

**Inform** students that they probe taxpayer to determine all sources of income.

**Instruct** students to:

- Go over what information is reported on Form W-2
- Verify Form W-2 entries on form match TaxSlayer entries
- Check tax year, name and SSN
- Recheck all data after data entry
- Check for missing Form W-2
- Use Form 4137 for unreported tips

**Remind** Unreported Tips topic is for Advanced certification

**Remind** students that household employees may not receive a Form W-2 if the amount is less than \$2,300.

**Ask:** What if the taxpayer has an ITIN, but a Form W-2 is showing a different SSN? Answer: Use the taxpayer's ITIN when starting the return. Enter the Social Security number as shown on the Form W-2 when prompted by the tax software

Scholarship and Fellowship Income (Form W- 2 and Form 1098- T)	Inform students that taxable scholarship income may be reported on Form W-2. If the amount is taxable but the taxpayer did not receive a Form W-2, it should still be reported on the return. ### Alimony

Remind Post-1984 to pre-2019 divorces, alimony and separation maintenance payments are deductible by the payor spouse and alimony and separation maintenance payments are included in income by the recipient of the payments.

**Remind** Child support is not alimony

**Demonstrate** where to get alimony information

**Demonstrate** how to report alimony

**Discuss** post-2018 divorces. The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act provides that alimony and separation maintenance payments are not deductible by the payor spouse and repeals the code provisions that specify that alimony and separation maintenance payments are included in income by the recipient of the payments.
